Dogs stolen in Pound break-in

Thieves broke into the Invercargill City Council's dog pound on Saturday night and took the two dogs involved in an attack on an elderly Invercargill woman last week, the Council's Environmental Services Director William Watt confirmed today.

Mr Watt said that it appeared that bolt cutters had been used to gain access to the Pound. The two Bull Mastiffs were the only dogs taken in the break-in and the matter was now in the hands of the Police.

"Members of the public need to be aware that the two Bull Mastiffs are dangerous, if uncontrolled."

"If you see them, or have any information about their whereabouts, please contact the Police or Council's Animal Control Officers immediately," Mr Watt said.
